CLASSIC IGNATIAN RETREAT (8 days)

The classic length is 30 Days. Saint Ignatius divides the month into four weeks. The 8 Day Retreat is modeled on the scheme of the 30 Days. The first 3 days reflect the first week: it focuses on God's love and on its opposite, the reality of evil. Ideally, this first stage will bring the retreatant to a good General Confession and to an attitude of inner freedom and availability for the journey of following Christ, in contemplating the mysteries of his life, death and resurrection.

The fourth and fifth days cover the second week about the birth and infancy of Jesus, Bethlehem and Nazareth as well as his public life and mission. The sixth and seventh days correspond to the third week which is about the passion, death and burial of Jesus. The eighth day focuses on the Resurrection experience which is the last week of the 30 days.

Every day contains an intention of prayer for the graces to be asked for, according to Saint Ignatius' suggestions as well as abundant Bible passages for the contemplation of the mysteries. The titles of the different days give a hint of the content of the daily meditations:

- 1. ALONE WITH GOD
- 2. THE GOD OF JESUS
- 3. THE DARKNESS WHICH IS IN ME
- 4. JESUS WAY TO THE FATHER

- 5. JESUS MISSIONARY OF THE FATHER
- 6. JESUS BROKEN LOVE
- 7. AT THE FOOT OF THE CROSS WITH MARY
- 8. A WORLD ABLAZE IN THE RISEN CHRIST

(2) THE GOD OF JESUS

- **GRACE:** A deep experience of God's love for me; of His covenant with me; of his everlasting faithfulness to me.
- **PRAYER:** Father, I abandon myself into your hands: do with me what You will. And for whatever You may do, I thank You. I am ready for all. I accept all. Let only Your will be done in me and in all Your creatures. I wish no more than this, O Lord, into Your hands I commend my life. I offer it to You with all the love of my heart. For I love You, God, and so I need to give myself to surrender myself into Your hands without reserve and with boundless confidence, for You are my Father. Amen.

HINTS FOR PRAYER:

1. GOD WITH US:

Thank God for the gift of Jesus. Adore God's humility in Jesus to us. See, consider how you are blessed in Jesus, living in a blessed world.

-Phil. 2,1-8 -John 6,16-21 -Eph 1,3-23 -1John 4,9-10

2. A FAITHFUL GOD:

Rest in the safety, security of God's love which will never fail you.

Adore God's plan: He has called you to be His son /daughter in Jesus to enter the intimacy of His divine life.

(3) THE DARKNESS WHICH IS IN ME

GRACE: A deep sense of sorrow and shame for my sins, up to the shedding of tears.

PRAYER: Jesus, son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner!

HINTS FOR PRAYER

1. SIN UNLEASHED IN THE WORLD:

Ask the grace of becoming aware of the reality of evil, the devastating power of sin, the smell of death and corruption in our society.

-Gen. 3,1-19 -Romans 1, 18-25; 28-32;2,1-10

2. MY PERSONAL SINS:

Let the circumstances of a personal sin, of which you have experienced the ugliness and debasement come back to you. Let your heart be soaked in shame and sorrow.

-Ps 51

3. THE SIN OF INDIFFERENCE TO CHRIST:

Consider the times you have turned the Gospel of love into trivial platitudes, a meaningless life...

-Rev. 3,14-22

4. SIN: A MYSTERY CONTEMPLATED AT THE LIGHT OF JESUS IN THE CROSS:

consider the devastating power of sin in Christ's body, face; in the body of the poor, suffering.

-Mt. 26, 36-46 -Mt. 27:32-56

5. THE HEALING LOVE OF GOD: MERCY:

Offer your wounds to be healed by the mercy of God, resplendent in Jesus: He heals you from your fears, complexes, from your past.

-Luke 7,36-50

-Luke 15,11-32

-John 3,28-36: Experience Penance as joy: He must increase, I must decrease.

(4) JESUS, WAY TO THE FATHER

- *GRACE:* That you may know Jesus more intimately, love Him more intensely, follow Him more closely.
- **PRAYER:** Abba, Father, you are the potter, we are the clay. Mold us and fashion us into the image of Jesus, your son.

HINTS FOR PRAYER:

1. THE NATIVITY

Jesus is born in Bethlehem in simplicity and poverty. Ask the spirit of the Beatitudes, ask the gift of spiritual childhood.

-Luke 2,1-20 -Mt. 5,1-16 -Mt. 18,1-4

2. THE NATIVITY (REPETITION)

Consider your Vow and spirit of poverty. Extend your shoulders to accept the yoke of Jesus, a burden of love.

-Mk. 10,17-21 -Mt. 11,25-30

3. NAZARETH:

Contemplate the hidden life of Jesus. Adore His silence, His sacred hands made hard by manual work.

-Luke 2, 39-52

4. NAZARETH (REPETITION):

Contemplate Mary in the family of Nazareth as a model of your life in the community.


Accept your sisters as given to you by God's love.

5. THE DESIRE FOR JESUS

Pray for the grace of a great desire for Jesus, His person in your life; to live in Him, to make your home in Him.

-John 15, 1-11





(5) JESUS, THE MISSIONARY OF THE FATHER

GRACE: Re-commit yourself anew as a religious and an apostle through your Vows.

PRAYER: Make me a channel of your peace:
Where there is hatred, let me bring your love
Where there is injury, your pardon, Lord;
And where there is doubt faith in you.

Make a channel of your peace: Where there is despair in life let me bring hc Where there is darkness, only light: And where there is sadness, ever joy.

O Master, grant that I may never seek so much as to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love with all my soul.

Make me a channel of your peace: It is in pardoning that we are pardoned, in giving to all men that we receive, and in dying that we are born to eternal life.



HINTS FOR PRAYER:

1. JESUS' PROGRAM: The Beatitudes: you are called to share the "blessed attitudes of Jesus and to work in order to make of humanity the people of the

Beatitudes.

2. SEQUELA CHRISTI:

Re-trace the circumstances of your religious and apostolic vocation: when you said YES to the Lord: Renew your Yes to Him.

3. THE TRANSFIGURATION:

Jesus' body. Your Vow of Chastity as a gift for the Kingdom.

4. ANSWER LOVE WITH LOVE

Let Jesus seal you: you are His exclusive possession.

- 5. THE MOST IMPORTANT QUESTION:

Who is Jesus for you? Live in prayer the experience of Peter, his answer and its consequences.

Jesus is the resurrection and the life.

(6) JESUS, BROKEN LOVE

GRACE:to follow Him more intimately, to love Him more passionately,
to follow Him more closely.PRAYER:Jesus, may all that is you flow into me.
May your body and blood be my food and drink.
May your passion and death be my strength and life.
Jesus, with you at my side enough has been given.
May the shelter I seek be the shadow of your Cross.
Let me not run from the love you offer, but hold me safe from the forces of evil.
On each of my dyings, Lord, shed your light and your love.
Keep calling to me, Jesus, until that day comes when,
With your Saints, I shall see your Face forever. AMEN.

HINTS FOR PRAYER:

1. THE WASHING OF THE FEET:

He loved them to the full.

- John 13, 1-15
- 2. THE LAST SUPPER:

A broken body, a blood poured out for us: the Eucharist. Do you do this and become this in His memory? Our daily Communion.

- Luke 22, 14-20

- John 6

- John 12, 24-26

3. JESUS' LAST WORDS:

Stay with the Apostles at the last Supper, listen while Jesus discloses His Heart to you, calling you FRIEND and pray with Him His last prayer, the priestly prayer.

- John 14-17

4. THE AGONY IN THEGARDEN:

Can you drink the cup that I am going to drink?

Your Vow of Obedience.

- Luke 22, 39-46

- Mt. 20, 17-23

THE CHRIST CAN SAY OF ME: "THIS IS MY BODY".



(7) AT THE FOOT OF THE CROSS WITH MARY

- **GRACE:** the gift of compassion: deep sorrow and distress to the shedding of tears, together with Mary, at the foot of the Cross.
- **PRAYER:** JUXTA CRUCEM TECUM STARE ET ME TIBI SOCIARE IN PLANCTU DESIDERO:

Near the Cross to be with You, Mary, mother, and to share your grief and tears: this is what I wish and long for.

HINTS FOR PRAYER:

1. ECCE HOMO:

The sacred Body of Jesus devastated by physical sufferings: the head, the mouth, the Holy Face: Jesus, King of Love.

Contemplate and see if you want to be His follower... Adore.

- John 19, 1-6

- Isaiah 53, 1-7
- 2. JESUS ON THE CROSS:

THE SACRED HEART:

Jesus is the source of the Sacramental life of the Church: water and blood, Baptism and Eucharist...Ask Him the gift of the Spirit.



- 3. AT JESUS' TOMB WITH MARY:

Jesus is deposed from the Cross. Sit with Mary, holding the dead body of Jesus in her lap. Mourn and adore... Wait for the resurrection.

(8) A WORLD ABLAZE IN THE RISEN CHRIST

- **GRACE:** the gift of love and contemplation: finding God in all things and Jesus in all people.
- **PRAYER:** Take, O Lord, and receive all my memory, my understanding, my will. Everything I have is yours, O Lord. Take it as it belongs to you. But receive it as my personal gift back to you. Give me only your love and your grace: they are enough for me and I shall not ask for anything more. AMEN.

HINTS FOR PRAYER:

1. THE RISEN JESUS APPEARS TO HIS MOTHER

Joy, love, gratitude... Silent contemplation.

2. THE DISCIPLES OF EMMAUS:

The full kerygma: the acceptance of the Cross as Resurrection and Victory. They recognized Him at the breaking of the Bread.

Jesus teaches us the fullness of His mystery: to recognize the Risen Lord in our deaths, in being broken because of His love. To be Eucharist.

- Luke 24, 13-35

3. CONTEMPLATION TO GAIN DIVINE LOVE:

Jesus and Peter at the lake. Jesus appears to Mary Magdala.

Tell Jesus that you desire to love Him.

- John 20,11-18

- John 21, 15-19

4. THE KNOWLEDGE IN THE SPIRIT:

Faith as our victory: Jesus and Thomas: CREDO, DOMINE, SED ADIUVA

INCREDULITATEM MEAM. I believe, O Lord, but, please, help my little faith!

- John 20, 19-29

5. A WORLD ABLAZE IN THE RISEN CHRIST:

The presence of the Risen Christ in the world. Christ drawing all things to Himself, offering the world to the Father. The universal reconciliation.

- Col. 1, 15-20 - 2 Cor. 5, 14-20

6. CONTEMPLATION TO GAIN THE LOVE OF GOD:

Finding God in all things: everything is God's gift to us (praise and thanksgiving); God present in His gifts (reverence); God working in everything (service).

FIVE DAYS RETREAT WITH THE GOSPEL OF JOHN

This prospect of Spiritual Exercises is inspired by a book in which a week retreat on **the Gospel of John by Carlo M. Martini** was contained: it searches for the classic themes of the retreat in the message of John's Gospel:

- 1. **GOD IS LOVE:** *it invites the retreatant to enter into prayer by John 15 and then to contemplate the Logos in John's Prologue (1:1-18). It develops as point of arrival the theme of friendship (Jesus heals with his friendship): the disciples, John the Baptist, etc.*
- 2. WATER, BLOOD AND THE SPIRIT: a contemplation of Jesus with Nicodemus(chapter 3), with the Samaritan woman (Chapter 4) and Jesus, bread of life (chapter 6): the sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist.
- 3. JESUS HEALS WITH HIS FRIENDSHIP (SIN AND CONVERSION): the starting point is Jesus purifying the temple (John 2), then Jesus heal our paralysis (John 5), our blindness (John 9), our death (John 11).
- 4. JESUS, KING OF LOVE (The Passion: "To be where he is"): the contemplation follows Jesus during the washing of the feet, the confidences, the priestly prayer, Jesus and Pontius Pilate (Jesus, king of love), Jesus and Mary, the Sacred Heart (John 13-19).
- 5. SEARCHING FOR THE SIGNS OF THE RISEN LORD: John, chapter 20 and 21: The transforming encounter with the Risen Lord: Mary Magdalene, the Eleven, Thomas, Peter, etc...

Indications are given also for a daily Instruction.

THE GOD OF LOVE

1. "GOD IS LOVE AND THOSE WHO ABIDE IN LOVE ABIDE IN GOD AND GOD IN THEM"

GRACE: A deep experience of the Love of God

PRAYER: Come, Lord Jesus.

Hints of Prayer:

I. ALONE WITH THE LORD: taste the sweetness of Jesus' intimacy in prayer (John 15)

II. POINT OF DEPARTURE: The Reality of God as revealed by the Logos (John 1, 1-18)

1. LOGOS: MODEL or ultimate reason of things. WONDER and ADORATION.


- Ps 63 -Ps 104- 1 King 19, 1-14

- LOGOS: CREATIVE WORD; vital dependence, sense CREATURELINESS: PRAISE AND REVERENCE.
 - Ps 139 -Ps 90
- 3. LOGOS: CO-ORDINATING WISDOM; PROVIDENCE
 - Mk 6, 25-33 -Ps 103
- 4. INCARNATE *LOGOS*: The MAN JESUS CHRIST, full of GRACE and TRUTH.
 - Is 43, 1-7
 - Hosea 2, 16-25
 - Eph 1,3-14
 - Phil 2, 1-11

This is the first movement in St. Ignatius: PRINCIPLE AND FOUNDATION: To recognize the Reality of God and my vital dependence on Him; "Thinking of me, he creates me; loving me, He makes me lovable" (St. Augustine).

INSTRUCTION: The 5 Levels of PRAYER:

- ✓ Receive the Love of God.
- ✓ Respond with ADORATION.
- ✓ May your will be done: to be like Jesus, the true Son .
- PETITION: ardent desire to be like Jesus.
- MEDITATION: to contemplate the mysteries of the Life and Person of Jesus.



III. POINT OF ARRIVAL: The Intimacy of Friendship (John 15, 15)

Hints for Prayer:

DIMENSION OF FRIENDSHIP:

- 1. JOHN THE BAPTIST: Friendship as joy, rejoicing in Jesus.
 - The Witness of John the Baptist (John the Baptist is alive and saved by his selfless friendship):
 - ✓ John 1, 19-37: "Behold the Lamb of God"
 - Ex 12, 1-28 Is 53
 - ✓ John 3,22-33: "The Bride belongs to the Bridegroom"
 - -Ez 16 Rev 21
- 1. THE DISCIPLES: Friendship as staying with Jesus (The mystery of Jesus is object of progressive discovery by staying with Him, abiding in Him)
 - John 1, 35-51: "COME AND SEE"; to ABIDE with JESUS
 - John 12, 26; 14, 3; 15,4;17,24

2. OTHER LEVELS OF FRIENDSHIP:

- Martha, Mary, Lazarus: Friendship: where to rest and be renewed (Trusting in Him in time of need, receiving the gift of Hid friendship, doing something gratuitous out of love):
 - John 12, 1-8
- > PETER: Transforming Friendship (From self-consciousness to self-forgetfulness):
 - John 6, 67-68: Peter's profession of Faith

- John 21, 15-19: Peter's profession of Love

- JOHN: Friendship as tenderness and intimacy:
 - John 13, 24-25
 - John 19, 27
- MARY: Friendship as silent syntony (Active Love):
 - John 2, 1-12: "Do whatever he tells you."
 - John 19,25-27 : STABAT MATER



PROGRESSION IN PRAYER: The Blessed Humanity of Jesus:

"A person can bear all things provided he possesses Christ Jesus dwelling within him/her as his/her friend and affectionate guide: Christ gives us help and strength; never deserts us and is true and sincere in his friendship. It is clear to me that if we wish to please God and to receive graces in abundance from him, it is God's will that these graces should come to us through the hands of Christ in his most blessed humanity, that humanity in which his majesty (God) has proclaimed that he is well pleased. A part from the fact that God himself has told me this, time and again I have noticed it in my own experience; I say it again: I have seen it with my own eyes that it is by this **door** that we must enter if we wish his Supreme Majesty to reveal to us great and hidden mysteries...

No other way should be attempted, even by those who have reached the heights of contemplation... This Lord of ours is the one from whom and through whom all good things come to us. He will teach us. If we consider his life, we shall never find any better or more perfect example for our imitation. What more do we want than to have on our side a friend so loyal that he will never desert us, when we are in trouble or in difficulties, as worldly friends do? How blessed is the man 9person) who genuinely and sincerely loves him and holds on to him. Consider the case of the glorious apostle Saint Paul: it seemed that he could do other than speak about Jesus continually, because he had Jesus engraved and printed upon his heart" (St. Teresa of Avila).

- **GRACE:** To know Jesus more intimately, to love Him more intensely, to follow Him more closely.
- **PRAYER:** ABBA, FATHER, You are the potter, we are the clay; mould us and fashion us into the image of Jesus Your Son.



4. JESUS, THE BREAD OF LIFE (John 6)

- a. JESUS IS GOD (1-21): Passover: Jesus renews the Signs of the transit of the Chosen People through the Desert: the Manna and the Red Sea by 2 Miracles: the multiplication of the loaves and the walking on the waters
 - Jesus performs a kind of Eucharistic rite over the loves
 - Jesus defines Himself with the name of God: "It is I", "I am He" = YAHWEH and "Do not be afraid"
- b. JESUS, THE BREAD OF LIFE: THE WORD (32-40)
 - 1. to eat this bread is to believe in the Person of Jesus
 - 2. the Salvific Will of the Father
 - 3. to be raised up to eternal life.
- c. MY FLESH IS REAL FOOD, MY BLOOD IS REAL DRINK:

THE SACRAMENT (44-58)

- 1. from the Word to the Sacrament
- 2. to eat the body and drink the blood is condition for life; the life of God in me
- 3. Jesus reveals His way of saving which is through the gift of a selfless love: His sacrificial death

- 4. this is also God's project for MAN: to be shown how to make of our life a sacrificial gift of love
- d. INCOMPREHENSION AND REJECTION (59-71)
 - 1. incomprehension of the sign: a material, earthly messiah
 - 2. incomprehension of the Person
 - 3. rejection of the way of Love and the Cross
 - 4. ONLY FAITH: Peter believes without understanding: Understanding through living, acting.

St. Augustine: "The one who loved me into existence cannot but love me into goodness"

INSTRUCTION: Prayer as a journey of CONVERSION (To pursue our fundamental vocation- to be holy.)

GRACE:A deep sense of sorrow and shame for my sins.A deep experience of Jesus' healing friendship

PRAYER: Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Hints for prayer:

- 1. JESUS AND THE TEMPLE: John 2, 13-25
 - 1. Every sin is a profanation: 1 Cor 3,16-17

The sorrow of sin (and God's anger)

- Rom 1, 18-32; 2,1-10



TRANSFORMING EUCHARIST

Here follow 3 schemes of Retreat (Spiritual Exercises) inspired by the Eucharistic Mystery. The sources are the encyclical letter of John Paul II: *Ecclesia de Eucharistia* (2003) and a conference by Card. Joseph Ratzinger: *Transforming Eucharist* (2002).

The first scheme develops the six transformations described by Ratzinger:

- 1. At the last supper, Jesus changes his body into a gift.
- 2. On the cross, Jesus changes violence into love.
- 3. At Easter, Jesus changes death into life.
- 4. In the Eucharist, Jesus changes bread and wine into his body and blood.
- 5. At the communion, Jesus changes us into himself.
- 6. In the world, Christians change people into the Kingdom of God.

The second scheme, presents the same material, but introduced by Mama Mary and following the words of consecration in the Mass:

- 1. TIBI GRATIAS AGENS, BENEDIXIT
- 2. ACCEPIT PANEM, FREGIT DEDITQUE DISCIPULIS
- 3. HOC EST CORPUS MEUM
- 4. HIC EST ENIM CALIX SANGUINIS MEI
- 5. HOC FACITE IN MEAM COMMEMORATIONEM
- 6. MYSTERIUM FIDEI: MORTEM TUAM ANNUNTIAMUS, DOMINE...

The third scheme enlarges the same topic to cover 8 days:

- 1. Life as Gratefulness
- 2. Count your Blessings
- 3. The Maturity of Love
- 4. The Priesthood of Christ
- 5. The Easter Experience
- 6. The Real Presence
- 7. Witnesses of the Kingdom
- 8. Mission into the Future

The last page brings 2 passages from "Ecclesia de Eucharistia":

Number 3: **The Eucharist in Time**: the link between the Eucharist and the Cross: Sacramental Representation and Memorial of the Cross and Resurrection.

Number 8: **The Eucharist in Space**, the cosmic aspect of the Eucharist as transforming Energy according to the booklet by Teillard de Chardin: "The Mass on the World".

The point of departure is EDE especially in two passages in which John Paul II brings some personal experience, two beautiful passages that conclude with a synthetic view of the Priesthood of Christ and of the Church.

"The Church was born of the Paschal Mystery. For this very reason, the Eucharist, which is in an outstanding way the sacrament of the paschal mystery, stands at the centre of the Church's life. This is already clear from the earliest images of the Church found in the Acts of the Apostles: They devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayers (2:42).

The breaking of bread refers to the Eucharist. Two thousand years later, we continue to relive that primordial image of the Church. At every celebration of the Eucharist, we are spiritually brought back to the paschal Triduum: to the events of the evening of Holy Thursday, to the last supper and to what follow it.

The institution of the Eucharist sacramentally anticipated the events which were about to take place, beginning with the agony in Gethsemane. Once again we see Jesus as he leaves the upper room, descends with his disciples to the Kidron valley and goes to the garden of olives. Even today that garden shelters some very ancient olive trees. Perhaps they witnessed what happened under their shade that evening, when Christ in prayer was filled with anguish and his cold sweat became like drops of blood falling down upon the ground (Luke 22:44).

The blood which shortly before he had given to the Church as the drink of salvation in the sacrament of the Eucharist, began to be shed; its outpouring would then be completed on Golgotha to become the means of our redemption: Christ, as high priest of the good things to come, entered once and for all into the Holy Place, taking not the blood of goats and calves but his own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption (Hebrews 9:11-12)"(EDE,3).

It is a marvelous number in which the whole encyclical letter is contained, which joins the present with the past and gives the feeling of the historical depth of the Eucharist. The other passage is even more personal and moving and gives the cosmic dimension of the Eucharist, the horizontal perspective of space.

"When I think of the Eucharist, and look at my life as a priest, as a Bishop and as the Successor of Peter, I naturally recall the many times and places in which I was able to celebrate it.

I remember the parish church of Niegowi, where I had my first pastoral assignment, the collegiate church of Saint Florian in Krakow, Wawel cathedral, saint Peter's basilica and so many basilicas and churches in Rome and throughout the world. I have been able to celebrate Holy Mass in chapels built along mountain paths, or lakesbores or seacoasts; I have celebrated it on altars built in stadiums and in city squares...

This varied scenario of celebrations of the Eucharist has given me a powerful experience of its universal and, so to speak, cost uc character. Yes, cosmic! Because even when it is celebrated on the humble altar of a country church, the Eucharist is always in some ways celebrated on the altar of the world. It unites heaven and earth. It embraces and permeates all creation. The Son of God became man in order to restore all creation, in one supreme act of praise, to the One who made it from nothing.

He, the eternal High Priest who by the blood of his Cross entered the eternal sanctuary, thus gives back to the Creator and Father all creation redeemed. He does so through the ministry of the Church, to the glory of the Most Holy Trinity. Truly this is the mysterium fidei which is accomplished in the Eucharist: the world which came forth from the hands of God the Creator now returns to him redeemed by Christ"(EDE, 8).





May the shelter I seek be the shadow of your Cross. Let me not run from the love you offer, but hold me safe from the forces of evil. On each of my dyings, Lord, shed your light and your love. Keep calling to me, Jesus, until that day comes when, with your Saints, I shall see your Face forever and ever. AMEN.

HINTS FOR PRAYER
