On the Edge of the Climate Cliff: Can the World Summit lead to more than "Stalemate and Failure?" This year's weather ranged from Hurricane Sandy and a U.S. drought that pushed up food prices, to an Indian monsoon and floods in Europe. Melting across most of the Greenland ice sheet and the shrinking of the Arctic Sea ice are of utmost concern. Nearly 17,000 participants from 194 nations are now making an urgent plea for real progress on climate change at the *U.N. Framework Convention on Climate Change* in Doha, Qatar, ending December 7. Changes to "Keep Fighting For" in Obama's Second Term. President Obama's re-election means holding him accountable for a list of significant changes. Many of these changes fall within *The Center for Constitutional Rights*' focus issues: (1) illegal detentions and Guantanamo; (2) surveillance and attacks on dissent; (3) criminal justice and mass incarceration; (4) corporate human rights abuse; (5) government abuse of power; (6) racial, gender and economic justice; and (7) international law and accountability. Eastern Congo: Armed Groups Unleash Terror as Displaced Numbers Escalate. With six million dead, the ongoing war in DR-Congo is the deadliest since World War II. Currently, about two million are displaced, the highest since 2009. 100s continue to arrive each day at the camps, including Kibati in Nyiragongo territory near Goma, which was captured by the M23 rebels. Recently, **Bishop Bernard Kasanda** of Mbuji-Mayi (DRC) condemned the U.N. and world leaders, for failing to act to stop the advance of M23, believed to be backed by Rwanda. On November 29, the **U.N. Security Council** extended the arms embargo and other sanctions for two more years, and hinted at additional sanctions targeting the M23.

U.N. Conference on Arms Trade Treaty to take place in March. Diplomats have agreed to hold a final negotiating conference on arms control, from March 18-28, 2013 in New York. Following intense lobbying by civil society, the resolution contains a proviso that "if all states are not able to agree to a deal in March, the U.N. will keep the treaty on its current agenda." This would allow the text to be sent for a final vote at the General Assembly later in 2013. **Read more. Sign up** for the *Control Arms* bulletin (multi-language), here.

Philippines: Framework Agreement on Bangsamoro. In mid-October, the Philippine government and the *Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF)* signed an historic agreement to hopefully end decades of armed conflict in the southern Philippines. The **Framework Agreement on Bangsamoro**, presently just an outline, is based on years of negotiations and on the recognition of a common struggle for peace and justice for the Muslim people of Mindanao (and other areas) and all Filipinos. There are 14 more stages leading to the full creation of the Bangsamoro, or "political entity," that creates basic law including a legislative assembly, if possible by 2016. **Find out more**, here.
